There are a huge variety of bird species in Glenealy. Below is a list of the birds and their habitat.

Name of Species Habitat

Common Blackbird Gardens, parks and woodland.
Blue Tit Wooded areas, parks and gardens
Common Buzzard Areas with Trees
Chiffchaff Wooded areas
Crow Areas with Trees
Common Pheasant Light Woodland
Collared Dove Parks and Gardens
Finches (Bullfinch, Hawfinch, Goldfinch, Chaffinch) Woodland Areas
Grey Wagtail Near Flowing Water
Great Tit Woodland
Hooded Crow Areas with Trees
House Martin Open Country – close to water
House Sparrow Urban and rural gardens
Jackdaw Prefers relatively open country
Magpie Trees with surrounding open areas
Pied Wagtail Open areas
Red Kite Light Woodland
Robin Gardens, park and woodland
Song Thrush Woodland areas, parks and gardens
Sparrow hawk Light Woodland
Swallows Open Country – close to water
Common Starling By houses and buildings
Wren (most common bird in Ireland) Gardens and woodland

All of the above can be found in Glenealy. At present there is a Red Kite residing in Glenealy (very exciting). There are also a number of Buzzards that you can hear when they are circling above, they have a distinctive song and call which is like a far carrying “mewing”
