Derralossory glebe-house, in very good order, built under the new acts, in 1815, at the cost of 996 <i>l.</i> 18 <i>s.</i> 5 1/2 <i>d.</i> Brit.; whereof 230 <i>l.</i> 15 <i>s.</i> 4 1/2 <i>d.</i> was granted as gift, and 415 <i>l.</i> 7 <i>s.</i> 8 1/2 <i>d.</i> as loan, by the late board of First Fruits, and the residue of 350 <i>l.</i> 15 <i>s.</i> 4 1/2 <i>d.</i> was supplied out of the private funds of Incumbent, who will be entitled to receive the whole of the sum, last-mentioned, from his successor. Of the loan aforesaid there remained 262 <i>l.</i> chargeable on the benefice in 1832, repayable by annual instalments of 15 <i>l.</i> 9 <i>s.</i> 3 <i>d.</i> Incumbent is resident in the glebe-house. N.
